We will begin our Fall festivities with:

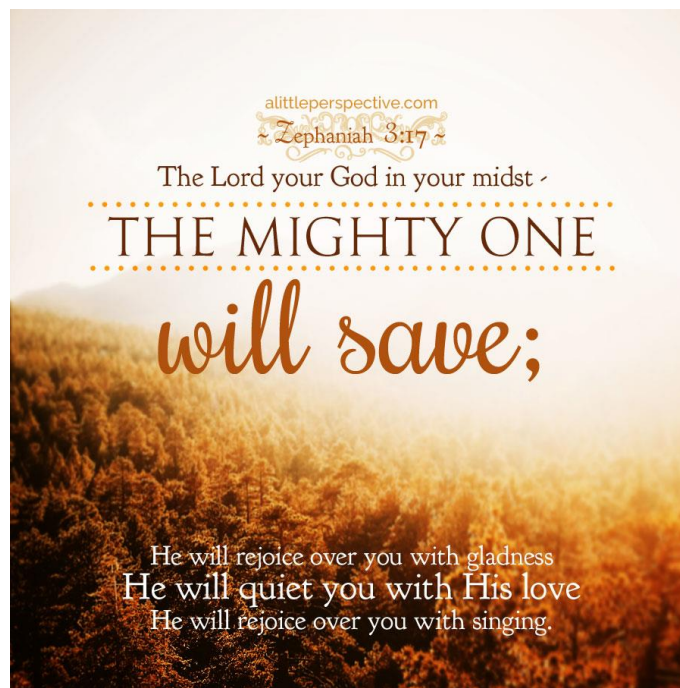
Yom Teruah (sundown September 8th-Sundown September 9th)

Zephaniah 3:17 – A Theme Verse for Sukkot

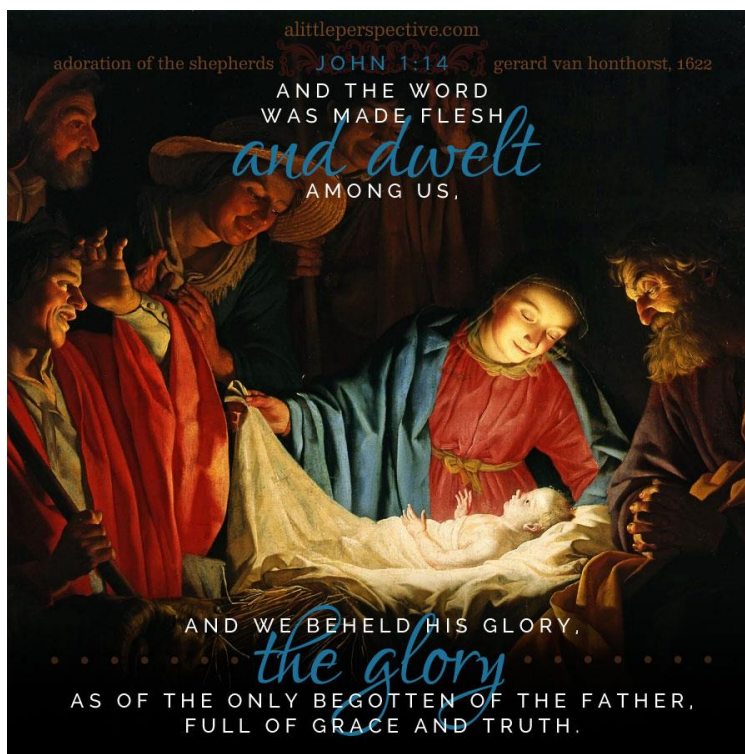

We are making tentative plans for the later date, but if by chance the moon is sighted in Jerusalem on the earlier date, everything will be one day earlier. We plan to meet at Shady Green Pastures Bible Camp throughout the week, for celebrations on the first and last day, as well as Sabbath. We also welcome you to camp with us for the week. We have the campground reserved from Wednesday, September 22 through October 1st @ noon. There are tent and RV sites still available. - **Activities** -- Activities on the campground include singing around the campfire, canoeing, basketball, ping pong, swimming, fishing, volleyball, hiking, bicycling, hayrides, farm animals, a playground for the children, and more! The grounds include a pavilion

for shared meals, a fellowship center with basketball court and kitchen facilities, and a chapel for worship and Bible studies. Area activities include MooTown ice cream, miniature golf, bowling, Amish bakeries and shops, and apple orchards. **We plan to gather each evening for music, testimonies, Bible study, and fellowship. Below is a schedule of activities we have planned. There is no requirement to participate in planned activities, but we encourage you to attend those that will help you and your family celebrate this set-apart time of the year.**

- **Shared Meals and Food** – We have planned several shared meals during Sukkot, which you can see on the schedule below. You are responsible for preparing meals for your family (breakfast, lunch, supper, drinks, and snacks including around the campfire), but we invite everyone to join together eating at family campsites and sukkahs, the pavilion, or the fellowship building (in bad weather) as often as possible! Please note that cabins and bunkhouses do not include kitchens or electricity. Electricity is available from the nearby campsites, but you would need to bring extension cords, etc. If you need help determining what facilities are available from the campground, please contact Katie Hirn. Remember that no alcohol is allowed on the campground whatsoever.
- **Camp Rules** – the following rules are set by the campground:
 - Children 13 and under must have proper adult supervision at all times.
 - Curfew is 11 pm; all children under 18 are to be at campsite or with parents.
 - Pets must be on a leash at all times. Use the dog walk area for pets, to keep the camp clean.
 - Absolutely no smoking, drugs, or alcoholic beverages! Those who violate this rule will be asked to leave.
 - Modest shorts and God-honoring apparel only. One-piece swimsuits only. (No bikinis.) Wear a towel or robe to and from the swim area. Males must wear shirts at all times, except when swimming.
 - Life jackets must be worn in boats at all times by everyone, regardless of age.
 - Keep all campground areas clean. If you use the kitchen, clean it. If you use the bathhouse, clean it. etc.

Sukkot Day 1, Thursday, September 23 – FIRST DAY, Holy Convocation

- Families arrive and set up their sukkah in the morning.
- 1pm – Sign-in, Rules, Organization meeting
- 2pm – Kids club "God with Us" with Tyler Ann
- 5pm – Gather at pavilion to share a **lamb feast**.
 - Bring a side dish to share. If you'd prefer a meat other than lamb, bring it to Jeremy by 3pm to be sure it is ready & delicious on time.
- 6:30pm – Worship Service lead by Jeremy Hirn and Andrew Elliott
- 7:30pm – **Daily Torah Reading**

Sukkot Day 2, Friday, September 24
